New Board of Directors

The end of the conference also marks the beginning of the New Year for the CIRPA board. Here's a brief introduction to your 2015-16 CIRPA board.

- Mike Krywy (aka me from Red River College) is beginning his stint as President, having spent 4 years on the board most recently as Vice-President. Sharon Shultz (formerly of Keyano College) has recently retired, but has left us remembering her friendly smile and the thoughtful guidance that she provided over the years.
- Sonia Richards (Nova Scotia Community College) moves from member-at-large (MAL) to her new role as Vice-President. In addition to her good humor, Sonia brings 3 years of extensive CIRPA conference planning experience to this roll.
- Stephanie McKeown (UBC Okanagan) takes over as Treasurer from Jamie Graham (Nipissing University). Thanks to Jamie for his term on the Board and the sage advice he provided over the past 2 years.
- Miranda Pearson (University of Regina) continues on as secretary (aka the person who keep everyone organized) beginning the second year of her second term.
- Garry Hansen (St. Thomas University) and Randy Roller (University of Manitoba) continue on as MALs, and we welcome Carmelinda del Conte (Mohawk College) and Charlotte Alexander (College of the North Atlantic Qatar) as new board members. These four board members will provide leadership in the areas of web development, communication, strategic planning, and networking and professional development.
- Cameron Tilson (Concordia University) will continue on in his role as Chair of the Nominations committee.

Strategic Plan Renewal

With the current CIRPA Strategic Plan set to expire in the upcoming year, the board began the renewal process in April 2015. The previous plan saw some significant achievements, such as creating governance documents and updating association by-laws, developing a new CIRPA website, and continuing to enhance member engagement through the annual conference and conversations via the member List Serv and the CIRPA LinkedIn group.

Looking ahead, the board needs to ensure that the next plan is aligned with the views of membership, and that it outlines a set of activities that are strategic, sustainable, and achievable.

In September a short survey was sent to recent CIRPA member to gauge perceptions on the mission, vision, and values, as well as to assess the current strengths of the Association and potential new opportunities.

- The survey was sent to 390 members with 78 responding (20% response rate).
- A session was held at the conference to further explore these ideas.

Consultation will continue over the next year, with the goal of providing a revised Strategic Plan at the next AGM in November 2016 (coinciding with the conference).
